(du)	<b>You</b> are the best pupil. So I can ask <b>you</b> . <b>You</b> really are my friend. I can help <b>you</b> .	dich dir
(er)	Dave? I can't see <b>him</b> in the classroom. I can't give <b>him</b> the book.	ihn ihm
(sie)	<b>She</b> isn't here. I can't ask <b>her</b> . <b>She</b> is a good pupil. I can't help <b>her</b> .	<b>sie</b> <b>ihr</b>
(es)	It's a big problem. Please look at <b>it</b> . It's too big for me. Help me with <b>it</b> .	es ihm
(wir)	We're English. You can ask <b>us</b> . We're doing the homework. Please help <b>us</b> .	uns uns
(ihr/Sie)	You're the best pupils. So we can ask <b>you</b> . You're my friends. I can help <b>you</b> .	euch/ <b>Sie</b> euch/Ihnen
