

## Simple Past 1: (to) be

Where **was** I yesterday?  
Where **was** Lady Brown yesterday?

I **was** at school in the morning  
I **was** at home in the afternoon.  
I **wasn't** at school in the evening.

Lord Brown **was** at home at nine.  
He **was** in the living room at nine.  
He **was** with Lady Brown.  
Lady Brown **was** happy.  
She **was** happy with her husband.  
The clock on the wall **was** old.  
It **wasn't** new.

Where **were** you yesterday?  
Where **were** the Browns yesterday?

We **were** at the cinema.  
You **were** at school yesterday. too.  
You **weren't** at school in the evening.

The Browns **were** at home at nine  
o'clock.  
The Browns **were** in the living room.  
They **were** happy together.  
  
They **weren't** in the dining room.  
They **weren't** hungry.

**was — wasn't**

Plural

**were — weren't**

## Negative statements

I **wasn't** at home in the afternoon.  
Lady Brown **wasn't** in the library.  
Her son **wasn't** in the living room.

Singular

The Browns **weren't** at home.  
The Elliots **weren't** in the garden..  
We **weren't** at the cinema.  
You **weren't** at school yesterday.
