

On Thursday Luke, Olivia, and Pia meet Dave in Greenwich. They are walking around and talking about music. Fill in **some or **any**:**

Luke: I'm a techno fan. England is great for techno. I've got **some** ⁽¹⁾ great techno CDs at home.

Dave: Techno music is too loud. I don't like **any** ⁽²⁾ loud music.

Olivia: I think so, too. I like disco music. Let's go to a CD shop.

Pia: Are there **any** ⁽³⁾ CD shops in Greenwich?

Olivia: Well, there are **some** ⁽⁴⁾ small shops in town.

Luke: There aren't **any** ⁽⁵⁾ really good shops.

Olivia: But there are **some** ⁽⁶⁾ really big shops in London. We can't go there now. Let's go to that small shop over there. It isn't bad.

Pia: Yes, maybe I can buy **some** ⁽⁷⁾ CDs there.

Dave: Have you got **any** ⁽⁸⁾ money, Pia?

Pia: Yes, I have. Well, I haven't got **any** ⁽⁹⁾ English money. But I've got **some** ⁽¹⁰⁾ euros. Can't I pay with euros here?

Dave: No, you can't.

Olivia: Well, Pia, I can give you **some** ⁽¹¹⁾ English pounds. And you give me **some** ⁽¹²⁾ euros when I go to see you in Berlin.

Pia: Maybe I can buy **some** ⁽¹³⁾ CDs with German music. So your parents can listen to **some** ⁽¹⁴⁾ German music. Let's go in.

Now they are in the shop and are talking to the shop assistant::

Shop a.: Can I help you?

Pia: Have you got **any** ⁽¹⁵⁾ CDs with modern German music?

Shop a.: I'm sorry. We haven't got **any** ⁽¹⁶⁾ CDs with modern German music. But we've got **some** ⁽¹⁷⁾ CDs with Mozart's music.

Pia: Oh no, I don't want **any** ⁽¹⁸⁾ CDs with Mozart or Beethoven. I'm looking for **some** ⁽¹⁹⁾ modern German music.

Olivia: And I'd like **some** ⁽²⁰⁾ disco music. Have you got **any** ⁽²¹⁾?

Shop a.: Yes, we have. I can show you **some** ⁽²²⁾ CDs over there.

Olivia: That's wonderful. Can we listen to **any/[some]** ⁽²³⁾ CDs?

After half an hour they buy **some** ⁽²⁴⁾ CDs and go home again.
