	Have you tidied up your room? [ <b>Frage: ob?</b> ]	Yes, I have. I did that <b>on Tuesday</b> . [ <b>Frage: Wann?</b> ]
	I have finished the book.	<b>When</b> did you finish it? [= <b>bestimmte Zeit in der Vergangenheit</b> ]
	Have you <b>already</b> eaten something? (Are you hungry?)	Yes, I have. I <b>ate</b> a pizza <b>half an hour ago</b> .
	Have you <b>ever</b> been to England?	Yes, I have. I spent my holidays there <b>last year</b> .
	Have you <b>often</b> been to England? (Do you know it well?)	Yes, I have. I <b>was</b> there <b>three times</b> .
	Have you <b>never</b> eaten a cheeseburger?	Oh yes, I have. I <b>ate</b> one <b>when I was</b> in America.
	Have you <b>just</b> opened the window? (It's open now.)	Yes, I have. I <b>opened</b> it <b>a minute ago</b> .
	Have you <b>always</b> gone to Kingsway High School?	No, I haven't. I <b>went</b> to a different school <b>from 2003 to 2005</b> .
	Has your cousin arrived <b>yet</b> ?	Yes, she has. She <b>came last night</b> .
	Haven't you read the letter <b>yet</b> ?	Oh yes, I have. I <b>read</b> it <b>an hour ago</b> .
	Have you been to London <b>before</b> ?	Yes, I have. I <b>was</b> here <b>three years ago</b> .

	I have read the book. (I know it now)	
	He has eaten. (He isn't hungry)	
	I have learned the words. (I know them)	
	I have written the letter. (It's finished)	
	He has dug the garden.	
	I have won in the lottery. (I'm rich now.)
