a) (not) to be allowed to. = **dürfen**, die "Erlaubnis haben"

I'm **allowed to** stay up until midnight on Saturday.
But I'm **not allowed to** stay up late during the week.
(Ich darf [nicht] bis.... aufbleiben.)

My sister **is allowed to** go out with her friends.
But she **isn't allowed to** go out alone when it's dark.

We **are allowed to** have a party in the living-room.
But we **are not allowed to** drink beer.

My friends **are allowed to** play football in our garden.
But they **are not allowed to** ride their bikes in the garden.

Yesterday I **was allowed to** watch a film until midnight.
I **have never been allowed to** watch films all night.

b) (not) to let (, let, let). = **lassen**

My parents **let** me **watch** funny films until ten at night.
They **don't let** me **watch** horror films at night.

I often **let** my sister **ride** my old bike,
But I **won't let** her **ride** my new bike.

Yesterday my father **let** me **drive** his car on the farm,
But he **didn't let** me **drive** in the street.
